



# DO YOU QUALIFY FOR A DISABLED PERSON LICENSE PLATE OR PLACARD?



(as defined by Article 6675a-5e.1, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes)

IF ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO YOU OR A PERSON WHOM YOU REGULARLY TRANSPORT, YOU MAY APPLY FOR A DISABLED PERSON LICENSE PLATE OR PLACARD.

\* Legally blind - If the person has not more than 20/200 of visual acuity in the better eye with correcting lenses, or visual acuity greater than 20/200 but with a limitation in the field of vision such that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees.

\* Mobility problems, which substantially impairs the person's ability to walk, if the person:

- ☞ cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest;
- ☞ cannot walk without the use of or assistance from an assistance device, including a brace, cane, crutch, another person, or a prosthetic device;
- ☞ cannot ambulate without a wheelchair or similar device;
- ☞ is restricted by lung disease to the extent that the person's forced respiratory volume for one second, measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 millimeters or mercury on room air at rest;
- ☞ uses portable oxygen;
- ☞ has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American Heart Association;
- ☞ is severely limited in the ability to walk because of an arthritic neurological, or orthopedic condition; or
- ☞ has another debilitating condition that, in the opinion of a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state, limits or impairs the person's ability to walk.
